Pali Pattali's version of the Abhidhammattha Sangaha is based on his interpretation of traditional Indian teachings on metaphysics and epistemology, an interpretation which is expressed in other religions like Hinduism and Christianity. It is likely that the majority of the Abhidhammattha Sangaha is also included in the Gita, like the book of 14 chapters Asanga's commentary on the Uttara-Karika (Book XIV. The Gita, which is from the Vedas, is guite different from Pattali's rendition of the Abhidhammattha Sangaha. I. THE SUTTA PITAKAS 1. The Sutra Pitaka The oldest Buddhist schools, called the Sthaviravada and the Sammitiya, were only of a single and rough kind of the Buddhist learning. Even these had to develop in a long time. In those early times the Buddha was not able to give the Buddha-Dharma to the world, but under his instruction only a few his disciples knew the Buddha-Dharma. Among these disciples, Mahakaccayana (Vin. XXIV.1:21) was the foremost in his attainments, and learning he practised as an ascetic and left him a pupil. Gautama, the Buddha, was famous as a spiritual teacher, but he did not give or show clearly the true method of attaining Enlightenment (Samyak-Sambodhi). Even his well-known disciples in their teachings on the true method of attaining Enlightenment were of the same kind as the earlier Indian teachers, who also preached and showed a system in their ascetic practices. Gradually, later on, when the Buddha knew that the time for his deliverance had come, he began to teach the Buddhists about the true method of attaining Enlightenment.
